Dear Members of the Board,

As Chairman of the local Community Policy & Management Team (CPMT), I must request a supplemental allocation from the Office of Comprehensive Services for At-Risk-Youth (CSA). The projected expenditures for CSA exceed the present allocation for Carroll County. My estimates indicate a total of \$3,571,797.31 in expenditures for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019.

Based on these estimates, the original local CSA budget of \$2,524,665 will be exceeded by \$1,047,132.31. The required additional local match amount (at 34.4%) will be \$360,213.51.
